Population Census Collections From Russia and Ukraine



In 2014 the human migration from Ukraine to Russia, or from Russia to the West, or, in the case of Russia, the annexation of territory resulted in significant changes in population. Add the dramatic decline of both countries' population due to lower birth rates, low life expectancies, unhealthy lifestyles and emigration, and the sum of these factors are important in determining population in today's Russia and Ukraine.

RUSSIA Population Census, 2010

The second national census held in Russia after the collapse of the Soviet Union. Published by the Federal Statistics Service, the census is in 11 volumes.

The most recent All-Ukrainian Population Census took place in December 2001 and was the first national census since independence from the USSR. Regional Census of Crimea, 2001 (available in July 2014)

A very rare oblast-level census of Crimea. Unlike the general All-Ukrainian Census, which covers 25 main Oblasts (regions) of Crimea, these volumes cover data for each Rayon (district) within the Crimean Peninsula, presenting unique data on the ethnic distribution of Ukrainians, Russians, Tatars and other nationalities of Crimea, migration, education level, employment, age and marital status.
